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This research is conducted for **albertapatients** by the Alberta Medical Association and ThinkHQ Public Affairs Inc.

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>>> Research Methodology

- Study fielded via online research panel
 - o Field dates: September 29 October 9, 2016
 - Panel Source: albertapatients
- n= 1350
- Weighted to reflect gender, age and region of Albertans who have used the health care system within the past year.
- This online survey utilizes a non-random sample; therefore, margin of error is not applicable. However, a probability sample of this size would yield a margin of error of +/- 2.7 percentage points at a 95% confidence interval.
- Accuracy of sub-samples of the data decline based on sample size.

>> Key Highlights and Implications

- Perceptions of long wait times at Alberta ERs is pervasive, but perceptions are not entirely consistent with experiences: almost three-quarters saw a doctor within 3 hours on their last visit to emergency.
 - Views are likely based both on experiences (bad) at some point in the past, and lack of information about ER and processes.
- Perceptions and experiences with ER wait times have real implications.
 - Over half of Alberta patients have at some point in the past NOT gone to the ER with a condition requiring urgent care, and many instead self-medicate.
 - o A plurality of those who have avoided the ER say that wait times were the reason.
- Many Albertans also have avoided the ER due to issues related to lack of clarity about whether it is warranted.
 - Roughly one-quarter say they didn't go to the ER because they didn't want their condition minimized (i.e., wasn't important enough) or because they are frustrated by seeing individuals at ERs who shouldn't be there.
- Alberta patients generally understand the processes of the ER, but lack enough information about how patients are prioritized and seen - which impacts their expectations and experience.
 - They do not fully appreciate the triaging process, nor do they understand (or see) the process of monitoring and reprioritization.



>> Key Highlights and Implications

- Wait times have a direct impact on ALL ASPECTS of the ER experience in terms of rated performance the longer the wait, the less satisfaction.
- In the absence of information to the contrary, most patients tend to believe that their condition is more serious than others in the ER which likely contributes to frustration.
- Based upon last visit experiences, a large majority of patients do not receive any indication of their estimated wait, particularly those who waited more than one hour to see a doctor.
- Patients waiting in ERs have a desire for more information about the wait e.g., how many patients (at what priority) are ahead of them, understanding the nature of triage and how their condition fits into that prioritization (i.e., why patients are being seen before them), number of doctors on shift, etc.

Key Highlights and Implications


- This exploratory research provides a strong base to expand upon in consultation with AMA and ER Section, raises additional questions for further research with patients, and suggests direction for improvements (particularly with respect to communication).
- Research suggests there are at least three points where patients would benefit from additional information about the ER and its processes:
 - The decision to go to the ER
 - Expected wait estimates are available. AHS online tool is very useful, but research doesn't measure ease of finding/navigating, incidence of use, etc.
 - Conditions which warrant a trip to the ER.
 - How your condition will be assessed how the ER process works.
 - Arrival at the ER
 - Explanation of how the process works, how patients are evaluated and prioritized, etc.
 - Waiting in the ER
 - Providing better understanding of where patients sit in terms of priority and why, updates on queue, means of estimating wait, etc.

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
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Perceptions of Emergency Department Wait Times in Alberta


Compared to your expectations of timely care in Alberta's health care system, do you think that emergency room wait times in Alberta today are long, short or about right?

Compared to your expectations of timely care in Alberta's health care system, do you think that emergency room wait times in Alberta today are long, short or about right?






Perceptions of Emergency Department >>> Wait Times in Alberta -By Last ER Visit-



Factors that Influence Personal Perceptions of Emergency Department Wait Times


When it comes to your own personal perceptions of emergency room wait times in Alberta today, which of the following would you say has had the biggest influence on your views?

Have you ever decided **not to visit** a hospital emergency department for treatment for a medical condition or health concern that warranted emergency care?





Have Albertans Avoided an Emergency Department >> for Emergency Care? -By Key Demographics-


Have you ever decided not to visit a hospital emergency department for treatment for a medical condition or health concern that warranted emergency care?

What did you do to manage your medical condition or health concern instead of visiting an emergency room?















Why Don't Alberta Patients Understand Particular Checkpoints?


You mentioned that you don't have a good understanding of how [a particular checkpoint] works in a hospital emergency department. Would you say this is more due to...?



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





Percent of Alberta Patients Brought to Emergency Department by Ambulance


Were you/your loved one brought to the hospital emergency room by ambulance?



>> Alberta Patients' Wait Time to see ER Doctor










Alberta Patients' Alternatives to Seeing ER Doctor on Initial Hospital Visit

[If "left without seeing a doctor"]... What did you/your loved one do instead of seeing a doctor?




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Urgency of Personal Health Condition Compared to Other Emergency Department Patients






How was Estimated Wait Time Communicated in the Emergency Department Waiting Room?

>> Was Wait Time Updated Frequently Enough?


Do you feel that the estimated wait time was updated frequently enough?





Was Assessed Priority Level Communicated during Wait? -By Length of Wait-






