

THE TOLL IN GAZA

Israel hit targets in the Gaza Strip for the sixth consecutive day on Monday. So far, as part of Operation Pillar of Defense, the IDF says it has struck 1,350 such targets. Officials say 91 Palestinians have died since the operation began; about half have reportedly been civilians. Meanwhile, terrorists in Gaza have fired more than 1,000 rockets at Israel, 544 of which have reached Israeli territory. Israel claims to have intercepted 290 of those. New Israeli airstrikes come as Egypt was trying to broker a cease-fire, with the help of Turkey and Qatar.

Below is a look at some recent major incidents inside the Gaza Strip.

Nov. 18: Israel sent 19 truckloads of medical equipment to Gaza's Jordanian hospital via the Erez crossing. The Israeli aid convoy also included 195 hospital staff members, who replaced outgoing staff.

Nov. 18: In the early hours of the morning the Israeli navy began shelling Gaza from the sea. Israel says it was targeting underground rocket launching sites and Hamas training areas.

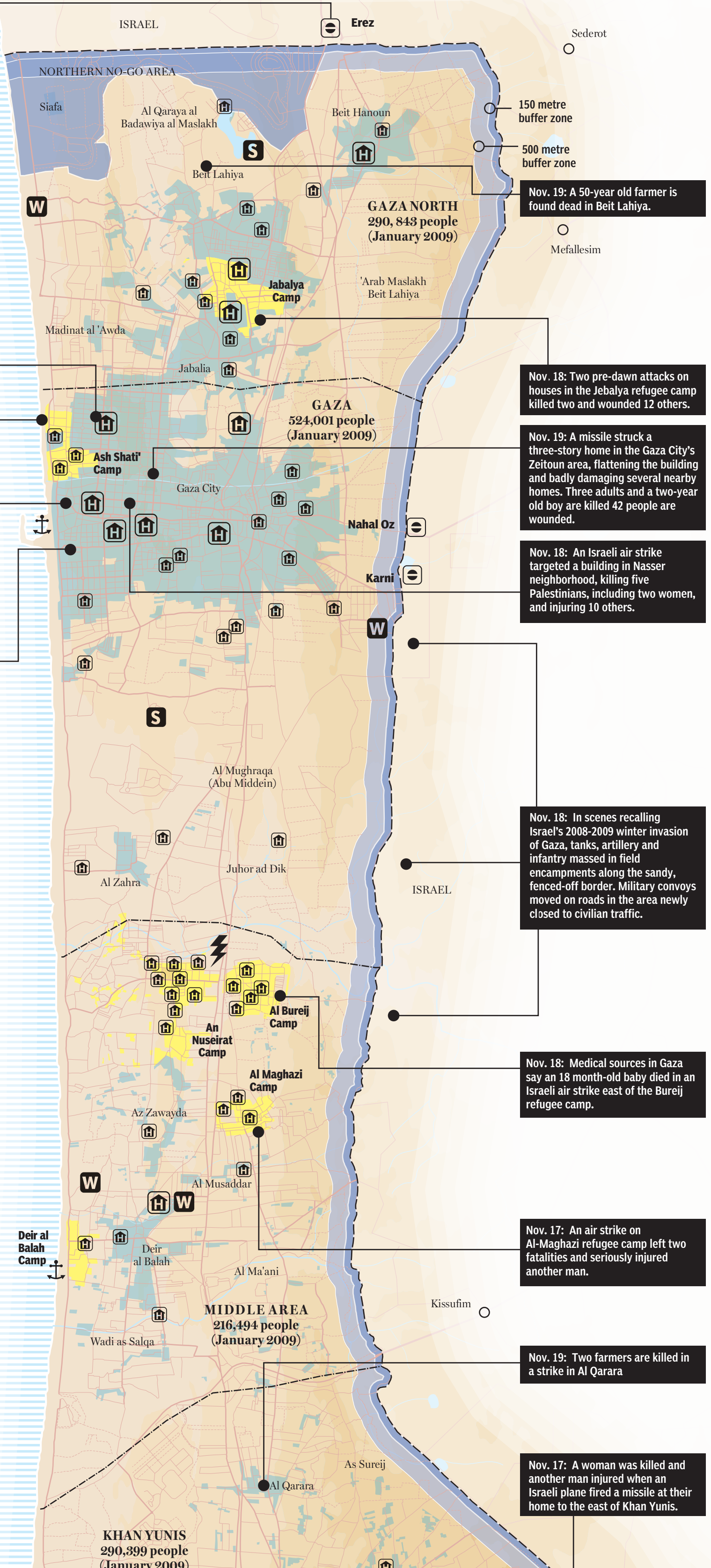
Nov. 19: At 2 a.m Israeli warplanes fired several missiles at the top floors of the Al-Shawa Wa Hassri Tower, a building housing local and international media organizations. Six journalists are injured, one severely enough to have his legs amputated. At 7 a.m. three Al-Asqa TV employees are injured when missiles hit the Al-Shourouk building, also known as the "journalists' building." Islamic Jihad says Ramez Harb a leading figure in their militant wing, the Al Quds Brigades, is also killed in the attack.

Nov. 18: 13-yr old girl & uncle sitting on beach killed by Israeli naval shelling.

Nov. 18: In the single deadliest attack of the Israeli operation so far, 11 civilians were killed in an Israeli air attack on a four-storey house in northern Gaza City. The Israeli military said the target was Yahiya Abiya, a top rocket mastermind of the Islamic Jihad group.

Nov. 18: Seven journalists were wounded when Israeli warplanes fired several missiles at the Al-Shawa Wa Hassri Tower in the Rimal neighbourhood. The building houses local and international media organizations. Around 15 reporters and photographers were on the roof covering the Israeli air strikes. The IDF said it was targeting a "transmission antenna used by Hamas to carry out terror activity."

Nov. 19: A 50-year old farmer is found dead in Beit Lahiya.

Nov. 18: Two pre-dawn attacks on houses in the Jebalya refugee camp killed two and wounded 12 others.

Nov. 19: A missile struck a three-story home in the Gaza City's Zeitoun area, flattening the building and badly damaging several nearby homes. Three adults and a two-year old boy are killed 42 people are wounded.

Nov. 18: An Israeli air strike targeted a building in Nasser neighborhood, killing five Palestinians, including two women, and injuring 10 others.

Nov. 18: In scenes recalling Israel's 2008-2009 winter invasion of Gaza, tanks, artillery and infantry massed in field encampments along the sandy, fenced-off border. Military convoys moved on roads in the area newly closed to civilian traffic.

Nov. 18: Medical sources in Gaza say an 18 month-old baby died in an Israeli air strike east of the Bureij refugee camp.

Nov. 17: An air strike on Al-Maghazi refugee camp left two fatalities and seriously injured another man.

Nov. 19: Two farmers are killed in a strike in Al Qarara

Nov. 17: A woman was killed and another man injured when an Israeli plane fired a missile at their home to the east of Khan Yunis.
