The facility, on Martindale Pond in St. Catharines, was built back in 1903 to be the home of the Royal Canadian Henley Regatta. It has held the world rowing championships twice, most recently in 1999. There was an \$820,000 upgrade to get it ready for the Games.

#### **Schedule**

July 11-12 Heats and repechages July 13 Finals in men's and women's double sculls, women's pair and men's four

July 14 Finals in women's single sculls, men's and women's light-weight double sculls, men's quadruple sculls, men's pair.

July 15 Men's single sculls, women's lightweight single sculls, men's lightweight four, women's quadruple sculls, men's eight.

### **How it works**

With their backs to the finish line, individuals or teams propel a boat down a 2,000-metre course. Sculls boats use two oars per person; other boats use one. In eights' racing, the marquee event of any regatta, a coxswain, a person facing the rowers, steers and makes tactical calls.

#### **Tournament format**

There are heats for each event, with winners advancing directly to the event final. Boats that do not win are entered into the "repechage," in which they compete with other losing boats to qualify for the final. Then there is an A final — where the medals are handed out — and a consolation B final.

### **Results from 2011**

Argentina had the most gold medals, with five, while Cuba had the most medals overall, with nine. Canada took home eight rowing medals, but none were gold.

### Why it's worth watching

There might be no sport that

provides an overall greater workout than rowing. Leg, core and arm muscles are all necessary, as well as the teamwork to keep it all going in a straight line at full speed. If you've scored tickets for the three days of finals, the day's programs are all wrapped up by 11 a.m., leaving the rest of the day open for other pursuits.

### **Competition outlook**

Canada, Argentina, Brazil, Cuba and the United States have the biggest teams here. The men's eight, who won silver in London, are perhaps the best shot for a gold here.
