Subject: Non-Academic Misconduct Complaint - Tim Haggstrom

To Whom It May Concern,

I am submitting a Non-Academic Misconduct complaint against Tim Haggstrom, a third year law student at the University of Saskatchewan College of Law.

Myself, and other students within the College of Law, believe that Mr. Haggstrom violated the University's Policies, Procedures, Rules and Expectations for Student Conduct. The particular area of concern is section (e) Discrimination and Harassment Policy.

Mr. Haggstrom has made numerous attempts to spread hate throughout the College this year. One such instance is a letter he attempted to share with the student body, which was subsequently blocked by the Law Students' Association and Indigenous Law Students' Association, as well as presenting it at a LSA General Meeting. I have attached the letter to this email. The discourse during his presentation to the broader LSA Community was incredibly harmful. There is also a letter that was sent specifically to faculty members and the Dean, however I have not seen this but am aware of its general contents.

Further, he was adamant about not including a formal land acknowledge in the LSA Constitution, to bring the organization more in-line with the University and broader community. His actions have contributed to the creation of an unsafe atmosphere for Indigenous students, myself included, within the College of Law. His various actions have had significant emotional, psychological and physical impacts on many of the Indigenous and non-Indigenous professors, teachers assistants, and students alike within the College of Law. Further, he has confronted some of the Indigenous students within the College surrounding this issue and is still unable to see the harm his actions have caused.

It is incredibly unsettling to know that a future legal professional still holds these racist views towards Indigenous peoples, as they will surely be interacting with Indigenous peoples in their careers.
