VISIT TO NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR (November 2–4, 2009)

Monday, November 2, 2009

(St. John's, Newfoundland)

Time: 17:30

Arrival at St. John's International Airport

Time: 17:15

Official welcoming ceremony to Canada and Newfoundland and Labrador at Mile One Centre. The event includes performances, speeches and full military honours for Their Royal Highnesses.

Tuesday, November 3, 2009

(Cupids, Brigus and St John's)

CUPIDS

Late morning

Their Royal Highnesses visit Cupids, the first English settlement in Canada, celebrating its 400th anniversary in 2010. Following a tour of the Cupids Cove Plantation Archaeological Site, Their Royal Highnesses proceed to the United Church for remarks and musical performances. Their Royal Highnesses unveil a plaque commemorating the Royal Visit for the new Cupids Legacy and Interpretation Centre

BRIGUS

Afternoon

Their Royal Highnesses visit Brigus, a small community known for its commitment to cultural heritage and architectural preservation. They will see St. George's Church, the church garden and Brigus Harbour. They will visit John Leamon Stone Barn Museum for a short presentation on the history of the town, architecture and story of the port.

Their Royal Highnesses will continue on foot to Hawthorne Cottage, home of the world-renowned Arctic explorer and mariner Captain Bob Bartlett.

STELLA BURRY COMMUNITY SERVICES CENTRE, ST. JOHN'S

His Royal Highness visits the Stella Burry Community Services Centre. He will open the new housing project at Rawlins Cross—the only building opening His Royal Highness will conduct on this visit—and unveil a plaque commemorating the opening and the Royal Visit.

MARINE INSTITUTE – MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY

Late Afternoon

His Royal Highness attends a demonstration and a discussion on sustainable fishing at the Marine Institute.

STUDENTS IN FREE ENTERPRISE—MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY

His Royal Highness meets with Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE). These award-winning students will present a series of their entrepreneurial projects to The Prince.

Wednesday, November 4, 2009

ARRIVAL AT THE LESTER B. PEARSON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TORONTO, ONTARIO

Afternoon

Their Royal Highnesses arrive at the Lester B. Pearson International Airport.

MEETING WITH PREMIER OF ONTARIO

Their Royal Highnesses have a private meeting with the Premier of Ontario, the Honourable Dalton McGuinty.

CANADIAN BUSINESS FOR SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CBSR)

Late afternoon

His Royal Highness meets with members of Canadian Business for Social Responsibility (CBSR).

ROYAL CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC

Her Royal Highness visits the Royal Conservatory of Music where she will have a brief tour of the Conservatory, including a visit to the recently completed Koerner Hall and a short performance by students. Her Royal Highness will meet students involved in Learning Through the Arts Program.

As Her Royal Highness departs, she pauses to read a plaque commemorating the 1901 visit of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall.

HERITAGE CANADA FOUNDATION EVENT

His Royal Highness presents the Heritage Canada Foundation's Prince of Wales Prize for Municipal Heritage Leadership.

Thursday, November 5, 2009

DUNDURN CASTLE

Late Morning

Their Royal Highnesses visit Hamilton's historic Dundurn Castle, built by The Duchess' ancestor, her great-great-great grandfather, Sir Allan MacNab, Prime Minister of the Province of Canada from 1854-56. They plant a tree in commemoration of their visit.

HMCS HAIDA

Afternoon

Their Royal Highnesses tour national historic site, the HMCS Haida. They will meet with volunteers and veterans, open a small museum and unveil a plaque commemorating their visit.

NIAGARA COLLEGE TEACHING WINERY

His Royal Highness visits the Niagara College Teaching Winery. Following a tour of the new Wine Visitor and Education Centre facility, His Royal Highness joins a reception and unveils a plaque commemorating the Royal Visit.

ROYAL REGIMENT OF CANADA AND THE TORONTO SCOTTISH REGIMENT PRESENTATION OF COLOURS AT VARSITY STADIUM, TORONTO

Evening

His Royal Highness will present colours to the Royal Regiment of Canada and the Toronto Scottish Regiment (Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother's Own) at Varsity Stadium in Toronto. Their Royal Highnesses will meet with members of both regimental families, including serving, retired and civilian supporters

His Royal Highness visits Evergreen Brick Works. He will tour the facilities and participate in several events.

Saturday, November 7, 2009

ARRIVAL AT THE VANCOUVER INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Morning

Their Royal Highnesses arrive at the Vancouver International Airport. They depart for the Vancouver Olympic and Paralympic Village.

VANCOUVER OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC VILLAGE

Late morning

Their Royal Highnesses visit the Vancouver Olympic and Paralympic Village. At the Southeast False Creek Seawall and the Habitat Island, they attend an Aboriginal drumming performance. They then proceed on a walkabout through the Vancouver Olympic and Paralympic Village, ending at the Salt Building, where they unveil a plaque commemorating the Royal Visit and join a reception hosted by the Government of Canada.

CANADIAN YOUTH BUSINESS FOUNDATION

Afternoon

His Royal Highness meets members of the Canadian Youth Business Foundation (CYBF). His Royal Highness will see six entrepreneur showcase segments, developed by young entrepreneurs from all regions of Canada.

VANDUSEN BOTANICAL GARDEN

Her Royal Highness visits the VanDusen Botanical Garden, plants a tree, exchanges seeds, and unveils a plaque commemorating the Royal Visit.

INSPIREHEALTH

His Royal Highness visits the cancer care centre at InspireHealth and meets with patients and physicians to explore integrative care and some of the important frontiers of health and healing.

Their Royal Highnesses attend a remembrance service at Christ Church Cathedral. They dedicate a stained glass window commemorating the 80th anniversary of the consecration of the cathedral and the 150th anniversary of the Diocese of British Columbia.

CFB ESQUIMALT

Morning

Their Royal Highnesses participate in a ceremony honouring the 100th anniversary of the Canadian Navy, which occurs 2010, at CFB Esquimalt. Their Royal Highnesses attend a reception at the Admiral's residence and meet members of the naval family, including serving, retired and civilian supporters.

Tuesday, November 10, 2009

(Ottawa, Ontario – Montréal, Quebec)

Morning

Their Royal Highnesses meet with Her Excellency the Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean, Governor General of Canada and His Excellency Jean-Daniel Lafond.

His Royal Highness then has a private meeting with the Prime Minister, the Right Honourable Stephen Harper. His Royal Highness will accept, on behalf of Prince William and Prince Harry, appointments as honorary Canadian Rangers.

His Royal Highness will then meet with the leader of Her Majesty's Loyal Opposition, the Honourable Michael Ignatieff.

Late morning

Their Royal Highnesses depart for Montréal, Quebec.

Afternoon

Their Royal Highnesses arrive at Montréal's Pierre-Elliott Trudeau International Airport.

Their Royal Highnesses meet the Premier of Québec, the Honourable Jean Charest and Mme Michèle Dionne.

CIRQUE DU SOLEIL

Their Royal Highnesses tour the headquarters of the Cirque du Soleil.

BIODÔME

Time: 15:20

His Royal Highness tours parts of the Biodôme and attends presentations on environmental issues.

BLACK WATCH PRESENTATION OF COLOURS

Late Afternoon

His Royal Highness will participate in the Black Watch Presentation of Colours. His Royal Highness will present new colours to The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada and meet members of the regimental family, including serving, retired and civilian supporters. Their Royal Highnesses will also meet with veterans who have recently served in Afghanistan.

REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE AT THE NATIONAL WAR MEMORIAL

Time: 10:48

Their Royal Highnesses arrive at the National War Memorial for Remembrance Day Service to join together with all Canadians in the National ceremony to remember and honour the more than 1,500,000 Canadian men and women who have served, and continue to serve, their country. They also honour the more than 100,000 Canadians who gave their lives so that we may live in peace.

CFB PETAWAWA

Afternoon

Their Royal Highnesses visit CFB Petawawa, where they will meet with military personnel and their families.

GOVERNOR GENERAL'S RECEPTION AND DINNER AT RIDEAU HALL

Evening

Their Royal Highnesses will attend a reception and dinner hosted by Their Excellencies at Rideau Hall.

Thursday, November 12, 2009

(Ottawa, Ontario)

TREE PLANTING AT RIDEAU HALL

Morning

Their Royal Highnesses will plant an oak tree at Rideau Hall as a commemoration of their visit.
