Today, U.S. shelters are killing 3.7 million dogs and cats



We need to reduce that number to 700,000 to save all of the healthy and treatable shelter pets in the U.S. and reach the No-Kill Nation Goal



Our Challenge

To save the 3M healthy and treatable shelter pets euthanized annually



This translates to less than 1 additional adoption per group per day!

• There are 4,000 shelters and 8,000 non-sheltered adoption organizations in the U.S.

 43 groups in 2 Bay Area counties adopted an average of 21 pets per group per day at Maddie's 2-day Adoptathon

It's time to hand out the megaphone!

Non-Pet	Lapsed	Pro- Breeder	Swing Vote	Pro- Adoption
29 MM	23 MM	8 MM	41 MM	14 MM

- Roughly 14 million people in the U.S. are Pro-Adoption: they adopted their last pet and plan to adopt their next pet.
- There are 41 million Swing Voters the undecideds and 17 million of those households plan to get a pet next year. They aren't anti-adoption; they just haven't decided how they're going to get their next pet.
- All we need is 3 Million Swing Voters to reach our Goal.




U.S. shelter deaths have plummeted since 1970

	Shelter Pet Deaths (Millions)	Save Rate	Deaths per Thousand People
1970	24	19%	115
1996	6	42%	23
2010 Expected	3.7	55%	12
2015 Projected	700,000	90%	2



The U.S. population is growing, and more households are adding four-legged family members



More Opportunities for Shelter Veterinarians

- Ten years ago, there was only one shelter medicine program
- Today, 24 out of 28 U.S. veterinary schools have shelter medicine programs
- The number of veterinarians specially trained to keep healthy shelter pets well and treat shelter pets who are sick and injured is growing by leaps and bounds


