# Williams and Wall Close the Year as the Best-Rated Premiers in Canada

Ontario's Dalton McGuinty and Alberta's Ed Stelmach cannot clear the 20 per cent mark.

[TORONTO – Dec. 17, 2009] – The premiers of Newfoundland and Labrador and Saskatchewan are supported by a majority of people in their respective provinces, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll has found.

The online survey of a representative national sample of 7,000 Canadians included large sample sizes in nine provinces.

Newfoundland and Labrador Premier Danny Williams is the highest-rated provincial head of government in Canada. More than three-in-four respondents (78%) approve of the way Williams has performed, while only 10 per cent disapprove.

Saskatchewan's Brad Wall is second on the list of popular premiers with 58 per cent. Nova Scotia's Darrell Dexter—who took office in June—is next on the list with 43 per cent.

The approval rating for Manitoba's Greg Selinger is 29 per cent, but half of respondents in this province are undecided about the way he has performed. Selinger took over from Gary Doer in October.

From November 23 to November 29, 2009 Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among 7,000 randomly selected Canadian adults who are Angus Reid Forum panelists. The sample includes 1,000 adults in British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario and Quebec, 800 adults in Saskatchewan and Manitoba, 450 adults in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, and 400 adults in Newfoundland and Labrador. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/- 3.1% for BC, AB, ON and QU, +/- 3.5 per cent for SK and MB, +/- 4.6 per cent for NB and NS, and +/- 4.9 per cent for NL. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population in each one of these provinces. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding..

The disapproval rating for the remaining five premiers surpasses the 50 per cent mark. Quebec Premier Jean Charest gets a positive review from only 25 per cent of respondents, while the proportion is slightly

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lower for British Columbia Premier Gordon Campbell (21%) and New Brunswick Premier Shawn Graham (20%).

The Canadian premiers with the lowest approval rating at the end of the year are Ontario's Dalton McGuinty (18%) and Alberta's Ed Stelmach (14%).
