#### What is this course about?

SOLARIS (Education for Sustainability 11) is an off-timetable 4-credit elective course that combines aspects of science, social studies and leadership. This course, which has been approved by the Vancouver Board of Education, will enable students to:

- understand the issues of sustainability, and their impacts;
- examine solutions; and
- develop a self-directed action project.

These issues, impacts and solutions will be examined from local, regional and global perspectives. This course will also enable students from various Vancouver schools to learn from experts in the field of sustainability, and then put this knowledge into practice in their home school or community.

## What is sustainability?

As described by the World Commission on Environment and Development, sustainability is "meeting the needs of the present generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs." Sustainability is a model for thinking about a future in which environmental, societal, and economic considerations are balanced.

#### Who is this course for?

- students entering grade 11 or 12 in September of 2011;
- students from throughout the Vancouver Board of Education

#### When will the course be offered?

- starting September 2011
- one Saturday per month (9:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.).
- one Thursday night per month (6:30 p.m. 8:30 p.m.).

Note: students must attend all sessions, except in the case of illness.
