Re: Halloween Security and Vandalism Costs – 2012

BACKGROUND

Facilities staff have been coordinating and implementing a Halloween vandalism reduction program since 1996. Annual costs for the past decade are as follows:

These costs do not include major insurance claims such as the fires at: Total Ed, Henderson, Henderson Annex, Trudeau, Moberly, and Weir which gave occurred during this period.

INITIATIVES TAKEN IN 2012

- United Protection Services Inc. was contracted to provide security services throughout the weekend.
 - Friday, October 26, Saturday, October 27 and Sunday, October 28: seven marked security cars patrolled sixty-seven sites from 7:00 pm – 2:00 am. These sites were identified as potential problem spots based on recent incidents of vandalism, as well as a history of problems during previous Halloween periods
 - Wednesday, October 31: ten marked security cars patrolled all sites

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within the district from 7:00 pm – 2:00 am. Additionally, twenty-one schools were provided with on-site security guards from 6:00 pm – 2:00 am. These schools were identified as a high risk for vandalism based on recent incidents, and/or past history of substantial vandalism during previous Halloween periods.

- Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2: seven marked security cars will again patrol the sixty-seven potential problem sites from 7:00 pm – 2:00 am.
- <u>First Student Transportation</u> provided buses with volunteer drivers on Halloween night to patrol the areas around thirty-four schools. The buses act as a mobile safe area for the children and the drivers help keep an eye on the school buildings and grounds. Volunteer drivers were provided with the emergency contact numbers for Operations Supervisors.
- <u>District Staff</u> made several additional arrangements to prepare for emergencies and to reduce the potential for Halloween vandalism.
 - Material Services staff were "on-call" during this period and had delivery trucks pre-loaded with plywood, lumber and other repair materials.
 - Maintenance department staff were also "on-call" in order to respond to any emergencies.
 - Operations Supervisors provided additional patrols of schools and support to engineer-custodial staff.
 - Purchasing arranged to have all BFI garbage bins and cardboard recycling bins were emptied immediately prior to the weekend in order to reduce the potential for fire.
