What initially began as a small regional event in the mid-1980s, has, over the course of three decades, become a critically acclaimed global music and arts showcase that boasts hundreds upon hundreds of diverse practitioners in fabulous settings big and small throughout the city.

Looking back, it's been a great ride with enough historic and memorable moments to fill a book. Who can forget the infamous onstage showdown between Miles Davis and Wynton Marsalis at Expo Theatre, or Sun Ra's "out-of-this-world" performance at The Commodore, or the rapid rise of Diana Krall from local artist to international star, or the mixed looks of awe and revelation on faces of audience members during a performance by Dutch master drummer Han Bennink. "A phenomenal success story" is how one scribe characterized the Festival and Coastal Jazz. Unquestionably, that success is due to a team of hard working people whose commitment to our mission of connecting artists and audiences through outstanding live jazz and creative music performances has been unwavering. Their efforts have helped Coastal Jazz assume a leading role in the cultural life of our community as the organization works to elevate Vancouver's artistic scene, promote economic growth, increase tourism, and foster positive social development.

Looking ahead, the future looks full of promise with renewed year round programming, Festival initiatives that include expanding the free concerts on the Georgia Stage by two days during Downtown Jazz, growing the Marquee Series at the Orpheum to include four major presentations, adding a prime show at the River Rock Casino, and activating an enhanced calendar of education and outreach initiatives.

On behalf of the Coastal Jazz team enjoy the 30th anniversary edition of the TD Vancouver International Jazz Festival. And stay tuned for an autumn season bustling with exciting event announcements.

The Festival is dedicated to the memory of our friend, colleague and past board president James Coverdale.



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

The Amsterdam/Vancouver creative music pipeline has yielded some fantastic collaborations over the years. Here, Dutch jazz masters Eric Boeren *cornet*, Wilbert de Joode *bass*, and Michael Moore *alto sax/clarinet* bring their monthly Amsterdam Ellington night to Vancouver, enlisting Vancouver creative music luminaries Dylan van der Schyff *drums*, John Paton *saxes*, Jon Bentley *tenor sax*, JP Carter *trumpet*, and Rod Murray *trombone*. Sure to surprise and delight, the repertoire ranges from well-known Ellington works to more obscure compositions. At once cutting edge and unquestionably engaging, The Bad Plus is among the biggest, boldest acts in jazz. Pouring huge energy and personality into originals and arrangements of Radiohead, Aphex Twin, Nirvana and Stravinsky, these post-modern jazz giants twist genres and push limits at every turn. As tight a unit as you'll find, bassist Reid Anderson, pianist Ethan Iverson, and drummer David King have great success looping in heavyweight collaborators (Bill Frisell, Kurt Rosenwinkel), and critically-acclaimed saxophonist Joshua Redman has the chops and charisma to reckon with the intrepid trio. With "boisterous exuberance and lyrical elegance" (All About Jazz). Redman's consummate artistry has helped define modern jazz as we know it.

The Ballantynes

The Ballantynes are dance floor magnets and party starters. Landing among friends wherever there's a crowd that's dving to shake, the Cascadian blue-eyed soul septet have played festivals like Squamish and Rifflandia, and shared the stage with legends like Lee Fields and Reigning Sound. This is must-see Motown-inspired Northern Soul.





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

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Returning for a fourth season, *Made in the UK* puts the focus on one of the most vibrant jazz scenes in existence over the past half-century. Phronesis returns to the Festival having now claimed the mantle as one of the most formidable trios in all of iazz. We'll also welcome the experimental groove of keyboarddriven trio Troyka, the critically acclaimed GoGo Penguin and finally Cloudmakers Trio, a kick-ass vibraphone-led threesome. Gratitude is due to John Ellson and John Nugent without whom this project would never have seen the light of day.

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
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
