The putty on the old windows in the house, has deteriorated and needs replacing. This is a job I can do. I was walking around the back of the house and I went between the house and the shed. As I walked over some weeds, my foot got caught in a tomato cage that had gotten overgrown and down I went. BUT it was like I was in slow motion, like I was held in someone's arms til I landed on the ground against the shed. I know who that was.....and that wasn't a Random act. I was in a place that no one could have seen me from the road.

I sat on the ground trying to figure out how to get up. I have arthritis in my ankles, wrists, elbows and shoulders (one of which is replaced) so it wasn't an option to push myself up from the ground or roll and get up from a kneeling position. I remembered the phone in my pocket (thank God for portables) and I called my neighbour's place. I saw no car but I chanced it, or else I would be there for quite a while. I sat there laughing about what I would say.

Leim answered the phone and I laughingly said, "This is not a joke.......I've fallen and I can't get up". He asked where I was and I told him and he said "I'll be right there". He was out of the house and over within 5 minutes. He picked me up and nothing was broken. I am still a bit uncomfortable but if he hadn't come over, it would have been til much later that I would have been picked up. Cheryl, his wife, called and left a message last night, asking how I was. I am sure she will call from work today.

The reason I thought of this as a 'Random act of Kindess is because it was not something I would of thought of happening to me.

So thanks to Leim for being there when I needed him.

I will have to do several Acts today to pay this one forward, although I try to make these acts, part of my life every day.

the chain of over 400 acts of kindness. A great visual!



These are some of the different ideas that the Character Crew was thinking of doing for Random Acts of Kindness Day...

Generate a list of kindness ideas to be shared with students.....so they have some ideas about how to help someone or just do something nice for someone.

Kindness Buddy (pick a classmate's name out of a hat an perform an act or acts of kindness for that person during the week)

Kindness Reporters (writing down some of the acts of kindnesses being reported to them..... then share some of those stories during the announcements)

Kindness Banners - displayed near entrances (recognizing Benson as a Kindness Zone)

Pay it forward cards being sent out to students and staff......

We will be handing out mardi gras bead necklaces. The idea is to give your necklace to someone you see who is showing kindness - a way to alert people and catch them being a good person. We are hoping that this will last longer then a day...

Talbot Trail:

Next week will be Random Acts of Kindness week at Talbot Trail. You will be receiving 2 laminated "Kindness Cards" in your mailbox. Kindness cards can be given to students and staff when:

- 1. You see someone performing an act of kindness, you give them a card for their act ie. Mark brings Amy a coffee so Amy gives him a kindness card. Mark now has the card, he sees someone else performing an act of Kindness and passes the card on.
- 2. Someone performs an act of kindness and gives a card to that person to pass on ie. Mark brings Amy a coffee and gives Amy the kindness card so she can do something for someone else and pass the card on...

It doesn't matter how the card is passed on - they are just visual reminders - the goal is to circulate the cards and get as many Random Acts of Kindness going as possible in the school. FYI - November 12 is Random Acts of Kindness Day in Windsor and Essex County.

If you have student parliament reps, they can help to explain to your class. Student parliament will also be looking for kindness stories to announce each morning so they may be interviewing staff and students who are "caught" performing acts of kindness. At the next student of the month assembly, we would like to have everyone stand who has been "touched" by a Random Act of Kindness. It should be a cool visual.
