



It all began in 1976 when Bob and his brother Al decided to venture out on their own along with their spouses, Janis and Sue, who were behind them 100%.

They purchased a building along with land from a very nice couple on Walker Rd. The owner had built

the building and lived upstairs. When the building was purchased by the Dixons, the couple built a new Bob and Al began the business; they found it difficult at the start because it wasn't retail, a store where

people would come in and purchase an item or two and pay cash. But they toiled on, and utilized their abilities and connections, putting the word out that they were looking for customers. They worked long hours, manning the shop from dusk to dawn. For five years they stayed in the original
